Key Features of the SecureBarHolder

- ★ Only consumes a 2x4 width instead of almost 8 inches like the others.
- ★ Innovative holes to allow easy access to the screws/bolts for fastening.
- ★ KITS: Clever locking tab closed bar holder PAIR allows for locking a "swing-out" barn door or even protecting many doors with a single bar.
- ★ Galvanized steel or galvanized steel with powder coat depending upon what you purchased.

Answers

These are much larger than a regular 2x4 and that makes the 2x4 loose in them.

They had to be big enough to allow a 2x4 to slide in and out of the "closed bar holder". If your 2x4 is exposed to weather and gets waterlogged you will appreciate the extra play.

(A 2x4 is only 1.5 x 3.5)

I can't get the shaft of my power screwdriver through the holes.
